

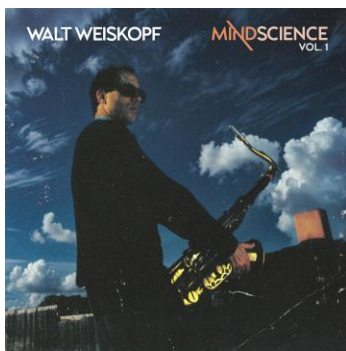

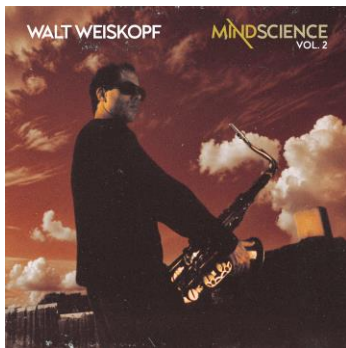
Denmark-based record label to digitally release American jazz saxophonist Walt Weiskopf 1990s recordings



Odense, DK. – AMM Records, a Danish label that focuses on releasing music through streaming and download services, announces the never-before digital release of “MindScience, Volumes 1 & 2,” a now re-mastered project of the original recordings of American saxophonist, composer, author, and producer Walt Weiskopf’s first-ever New York band.

Recorded in Long Island, N.Y., U.S.A. in 1989-90, the quartet consisted of Weiskopf himself, brother Joel Weiskopf (piano) – who was fresh off the Woody Herman Band at the time – bassist Jay Anderson, and drummer Jeff Hirshfield.

Says Anders Mogensen, “As the CEO of AMM Records, I am very honored to release the double-volume ‘MindScience’ albums. This music had a huge influence on the 90s era jazz culture, so it’s obvious to AMM that this music now needs to be accessible on today’s music platforms.”



“MindScience” is comprised of two albums of seven tunes each. Volumes 1 and 2 will be released on October 25 and December 6 respectively, and can be found on all digital platforms (i.e., Spotify, Apple, etc.).

“I’m so happy to announce the re-release of material from my first two albums which have been out-of-print and unavailable for over 30-years, says Weiskopf about the project. A huge thank you to AMM records for making this music come alive again.”

AMM Records will release the following singles from both volumes, prior to and in conjunction with the full two-volume release:

- *Intuition*, MindScience (Vol. 1) – Oct. 4, 2024
- *Mr. Golyadkin*, MindScience (Vol. 1) – Oct. 25, 2024
- *Salvador*, MindScience (Vol. 2) – Nov. 15, 2024
- *Nonfiction*, MindScience (Vol. 2) – Dec. 6, 2024

About Walt Weiskopf:

With critically-acclaimed albums and countless sideman credits, Walt started his career with the Buddy Rich band at the age of 21. In the years since, he has released more than 20 CDs featuring a stellar cast of the best contemporary jazz musicians including Brad Mehldau, John Pattituci, Joe Magnarelli, Renee Rosnes, Joe Locke, Conrad Herwig, Peter Zak, Billy Drummond, and Peter Washington, to name a few.
